Special Units and Projects

Superkids Reading is the program used in my kindergarten classroom. It is a deliberate and thoughtful text approach built on systematic phonics. One goal of the program is to make legible and fluent handwriting an automatic and mastered skill. In kindergarten, children learn the 26 letters of the alphabet and one sound for each letter, then apply their new skills to blend sounds to read words and sentences. This program integrates reading, writing, grammar and spelling through a super fun, interactive and hands-on approach! It is completely aligned with the state standards. **Superkids Reading** teaches children foundational skills as they learn to understand the relationship between written and spoken language. By the end of the kindergarten school year, children will be able to read, write and spell hundreds of short-vowel words!
